Live-work townhomes give freedom to wake up, walk downstairs and do business

As more people choose to work from home, it's perhaps not surprising that Greater Vancouver real estate developers, city planners and designers are teaming together to create contemporary housing options and flexible floor plans that provide buyers ample space to work without trading in living space. Committed to enhancing lifestyles, **PARKLANE HOMES** recently introduced **THE VIEWS** to the marketplace. With only five homes, this Port Moody development is exclusive, yet with its modern live-work design is providing buyers with the freedom to take care of business from home. Morning has broken, and across the Lower Mainland, morning commuters are waking, dressing and getting into their cars only to be met face-to-face with the reality of... TRAFFIC. A tour through the 1,802-sq.-ft. showhome gives a sense of how streamline life could be. The studio is decked out with modern office furniture, including a black desk, accent chair and a fun retro-style rotary dial phone. Well mapped out for a home-based business, there's a front hall closet to hang coats and a sparkling powder room with pedestal sink and crisp white towels.
